## A Message from Ms Stroud-Turp

Dear Queen's families,

Welcome back to Summer Term 2. Ms Verge and I were away with year 6 last week on their residential trip to Osmington Bay. We were privileged to spend the week with our lovely year 6 pupils and reflect on what confident and resilient young people they have become.

In school that week I know parents were treated to some wonderful musical sharing by year 2, 3 and 4 – thank you to parents who were able to join us and Mrs Noyes and class teachers for organising.

Thank you also to our ECO team and year 3 who organised our first re-fill session – what a fantastic initiative. If you missed out, they will be at the Summer Fair on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> July – see details below. I will certainly be bringing my bottles and using these fantastic sustainable products.

We have now finished all the statutory assessments, Year 6 SATS, Year 2 SATS, Year 4 Multiplication test and year 1 phonics screening and all our internal assessments. Congratulations to all our pupils for completing their tests so calmly.

This half term we are thinking about miracles and healing. We may think that we have never seen a miracle but really we see them every day in the world around us, we share a prayer:

As the weather remains hot, parents are reminded of the need for all pupils to have water bottles and hats and to apply sun cream before coming to school. We are vigilant around the recent warnings of high pollution and heat in ensuring children have regular water breaks and have breaks in the shade during PE sessions to reduce physical exertion.

In line with advice From Defra we ask parents/carers to:

- If possible, not to drive their children to and from school, as this exacerbates pollution in the school vicinity.
- For those who continue to drive, please do not idle engines in the school vicinity.

### **School environment:**

We are always looking for ways to improve the school environment and over half term we continued with fans being installed in more classrooms, to help airflow. This has been a great benefit this week!

We are now considering how we can improve the acoustics in the main hall:

### **Is there an acoustic engineer in our school community?**

Our appeal for help designing the new logo revealed something of the breadth of talent we have in our school community (thanks Mr Sid Ali). We are encouraged by that to ask now if there is anyone with relevant skills to help come up with a cost-effective way to make the hall less noisy (other than making the children eat in silence!). We think the source of the problem is that all the surfaces in the hall are hard and reflective, but we don't know what the most effective and affordable way to mitigate that might be. What do you think she will say?

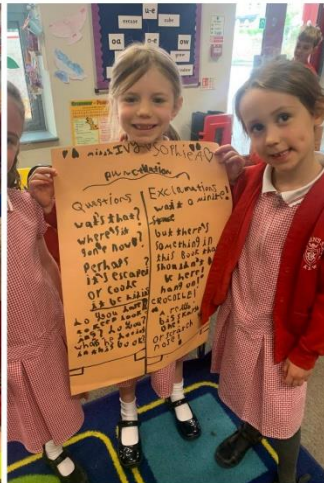




In year 1 we have been learning about division and sharing in unequal groups.

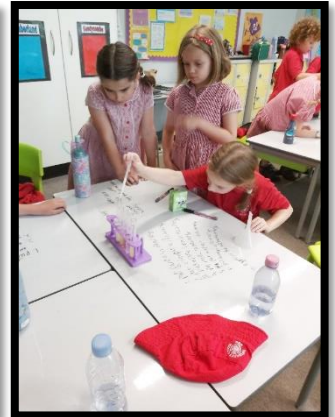
## Amazing Egyptians

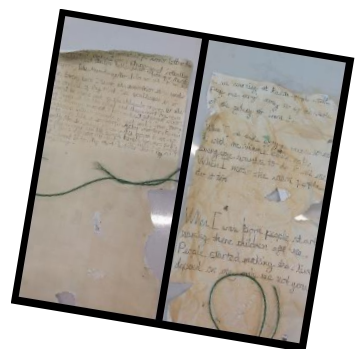




We really enjoyed doing learning about Njembe drumming with Mrs Noyes in Music.



We set up an investigation to see which drinks are good and bad for our teeth. We will let you know the results next week.

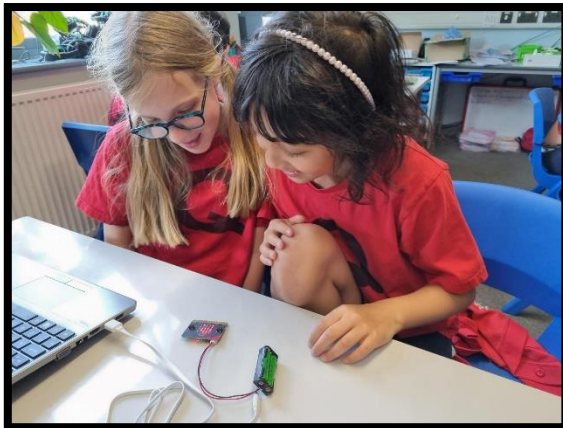
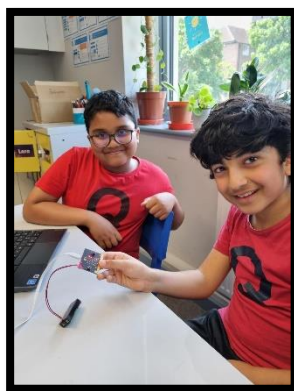
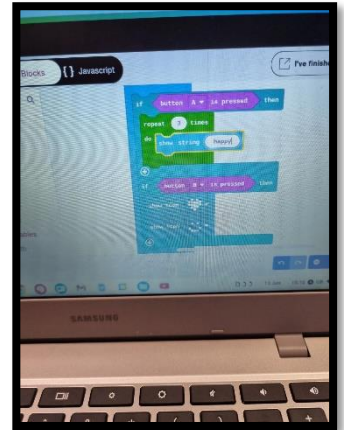
