Gates at pick-up time

In an attempt to reduce the congestion at the end of day, we ask that once you have collected your child, you move away from the gates and off site as soon as possible. We remind you that once we have handed over your child to you they are your responsibility. To keep the site safe, we will be closing both Cumberland Road gates promptly after pick-up time at 3:30pm and reopening them for clubs pick-up at 4:15pm. You can of course still get in and out by buzzing to ask the office to open the gate – though once the gates have been closed, we would ask you to use the small pedestrian gate, as the delivery vehicle gate takes so long to open and close. We will trial this arrangement for a couple of weeks after half term to see whether the balance of risk against inconvenience is appropriate.

Please read below a message from Mr Megrah about a fantastic achievement. I would like to thank Mr Megrah and all the staff who help provide an amazing PE and sports offer to the children of the King's. As you'll see below, all this hard work and commitment has been nationally recognised.

The School Games Mark is a national recognised award for a school's commitment to PE and school sport, including opportunities for competition and participation in curricular and extra-curricular activities. The standard of a school's provision is measured in medals, progressing from Bronze, through to Silver, to Gold and, ultimately, to the Platinum Award.

Our school has maintained Gold status for a number of years, highlighting the consistently excellent level of sporting provision on offer at The King's.

With Gold as our base, in early 2023 we decided to go for Platinum. We focused on the goal of delivering and engaging in competitions that have clear intent and create positive experiences for our children. We also wanted to support the personal development of our children through sports leadership and involve them in shaping our PE provision. At The King's, we train our Year 5s to become confident leaders in sport (Sports Leaders), delivering activities to other year groups and eventually taking their skills onto the playground during break times throughout Years 5 and 6. Included in the training was Year 5's successful delivery of our Sports day for KS1 children in July. With Sports Leader training an established part of our provision at The King's, we presented our provision to be assessed by Richmond Borough.

Following our presentation to the Borough, we are proud to announce that The King's school has now been awarded... Platinum! We will strive to maintain this pinnacle status going forward.
