



# How can you show LOVE in your everyday life?

- By making sure people are okay
- Helping others when they struggle
- Being nice to everybody
- Making new friends

We can also show **love** by:

- Being kind to each other
- Thinking of others before ourselves
- Doing something nice for someone
- Being a good friend and caring



When you **love** something or someone, you care deeply about them or it and it is precious to you.

At The King's School, all the staff want you to **love** coming here to learn, to develop yourself, to develop friendships and to show **love** for everyone in The King's School Family.



How can you show COMPASSION in your everyday life?

- By if someone is hurt support them
- Look around the playground if someone is upset
- Look after new pupils

We can also show **compassion** by:

- Thinking how someone might feel if we were to say or do something unkind to them
- Reflecting on our words and actions
- Helping others when they are hurt-by either words or actions of others

When you have **compassion** for something, you believe in it, you have trust and confidence in it.

When you show **compassion** at The King's School, it means you are caring and you want to help someone.



How can you show RESPECT in your everyday life?


- By showing people respect when they speak
- Treat everyone the same

We can also show **respect** by:

- Listening and replying politely to others
- Following the rules of your class, the school and on the playground
- Taking care of the environment, your property and others

When you have **respect** something or someone, you admire it or them and you think about their feelings and how they should be treated.

Our hope at The King's School is that you, as our pupils, will always treat other people the way you would like to be treated yourself. If you can do this, then you will be showing **respect** to them.



## End of Playtime and Lunchtime Arrangements

- We want everyone to be respectful when coming in to school at the end of play and lunchtimes-this means coming in to school in silence.
- There might be a consequence if you are talking.
- It helps get everyone ready and calm after busy playtimes and ready to do your best learning when back in class
- Two bells will ring at play and lunchtime
- First bell is to tidy away any equipment and make your way to your line
- Second bell is for absolute silence to show you are being respectful and ready to go in to class-just like you do when coming in for Worship
